13. New Business – Lavoie

- a. Review of 10-year Full Member grade requirement for Fellow nominees
 - i. We have had a handful of potential members who don't meet the 10-year Full Member grade requirement reach out to staff to inquire about applying their Full Member grade retroactively since they were unaware that they qualified for membership advancement to Full Member grade.
 - ii. Current definitions regarding Fellow membership requirement include:

- 1. The 'Guidelines for ASHRAE Fellow Nominators' states that one of the requirements for eligible for election to Fellow is "Good standing as a Full Member grade for at least ten (10) years".
- 2. The ASHRAE Bylaws states that a Fellow "has been in good standing as a Full Member for at least ten (10) years".
- iii. Until now staff has approved these requests, but it is recommended that H&A discuss and approve one of the following decisions:
 - 1. Do not allow adjustments to the start date of a member's Full Member grade status.
 - 2. Allow adjustments to the start date of a member's Full Member grade status as long as staff can confirm that they would have qualified for Full Member grade as of the previous date.
 - 3. Update the membership requirement from 10-years of Full Member grade to a certain number of years of Society-approved experience. (Society-approved experience pertains to how an Associate member qualifies for advancement to Full Member and includes education, licenses, and work experience.) For example, the Bylaws could be updated to read that a Fellow "is a Full Member in good standing with at least x years of equivalent Society-approved experience".
- iv. Motion #6: To leave the Fellow membership requirement as-is and not allow retroactive application of Full Member grade. Vote: 9-0-0. Moved by Adam, second by Tom.
- v. *Action Item #12*: Refer the following to the MP Committee: Does MP still notify Associate when they may be eligible for advancement? Is there a way to automate the advancement process? Can we add Fellow to the list of reasons to advance?
- b. Request for DSA/ESA Point Tally Form update:
 - i. From CEC Chair, Kristen Cetin:
 - 1. There is a CEC ad hoc committee focused on encouraging and rewarding ASHRAE members who review conference and journal papers.
 - 2. CEC often has trouble finding enough reviewers for conference papers
 - 3. They were brainstorming how to motivate reviewers and encourage more participation, and discussed adding points to the DSA/ESA Point Tally Form
 - 4. Discussion with Kristen:
 - a. These are technical reviews, not
 - b. Abstracts are 3-pages and take about 30 minutes to review
 - c. Conference papers are 8-pages and take about an hour to review. Members may review a couple at a time.
 - d. Journal articles are 30-40 pages and take about two hours to review. Members typically review one at a time.
 - e. Conference papers are the most common the next conference will have 200 papers.
 - 5. *Action Item #13:* Finalize point value and wording. Nico proposed that completing 4-5 reviews earns ¹/₄ point. Maximum of 2 or 3 points.

Category: Personal Honors

Name: EUNICE NEWTON FOOTE DECARBONIZATION AWARD

<u>Reason for Establishment:</u> At the request of the Presidential-Elect Advisory Committee it was noted that an award for works done to decarbonize the built environment was not currently part of ASHRAE awards and recognitions. Due to the increased focus by ASHRAE, and its investment to be a leader in this area, it was suggested that an award to recognize individuals taking on the decarbonization challenge, should be recognized. The award description and scoring process below, as well as the mini-biography should explain why Eunice Newton Foote was selected.

<u>Funding Source:</u> This award will be planned into the annual budget of Honors and Awards once accepted. We understand that future funding and inflation must be considered. If a standing committee is created on decarbonization, they would assume the responsibility of this award financially.

<u>Selection Criteria:</u> Please see this award's suggested description and scoring criteria. Please note that the formatting and concept of scoring is based on the Environmental Health Award.

EUNICE NEWTON FOOTE DECARBONIZATION AWARD

This award is named in honor of Eunice Newton Foote, who is the scientist attributed to being the first to conclude that certain gases warmed when exposed to sunlight and that rising carbon dioxide levels would change atmospheric temperature (known today as greenhouse gas effect) and impact climate.

This award honors members for notable achievement, outstanding work, or service that is focused on the decarbonization of the built environment.

The Honors & Awards (H&A) (until a standing committee on decarbonization is formed) committee will annually review all eligible nominations received.

PROCEDURES FOR THE EUNICE NEWTON FOOTE DECARBONIZATION AWARD

1. Purpose. The purpose of the award is to recognize excellence in volunteer service focused on the decarbonization of the built environment. It will heighten general membership awareness of, and interest in, the benefits of decarbonization and its impact on our climate.

2. Award Presentation. Each year the Society recognizes the outstanding efforts of a single volunteer around decarbonization activities. Nominations are solicited during the first half of the Society year. The Honors and Awards Committee will determine the single nominee for each Society Year.

3. Eligibility Requirements. The award is open to ASHRAE members and non-members who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in the ASHRAE decarbonization activities. The recipient will be selected from all nominations that meet a 5 point minimum requirement as outlined under Section 7 Criteria for Selecting Recipients.

4. Judging. Honors and Awards Committee will review all eligible nominations received at the ASHRAE Winter Meeting. While the point total should be considered, it should not be used as the only criteria for selection. The summary document and perceived importance of the activities should be evaluated. The award may be omitted if a suitable candidate is not identified.

5. Presentation. The Eunice Newton Foote Decarbonization Award is presented during the Honors and Awards portion of the Plenary Session at the ASHRAE Annual Meeting. A plaque and medallion (composed of fully recycled materials) is presented to the recipient by the ASHRAE President.

6. Application. A nomination for the Eunice Newton Foote Decarbonization Award should include a cover letter outlining the nominee's decarbonization activities in ASHRAE. This summary should contain an explanation, no more than 300 words, of the nominee's qualifications. Documentation of non-ASHRAE bio activities with regards to reducing your carbon footprint, or local sustainability projects, that project information or details should be an attachment (no more than 5 pages) attached to the summary.

It is due to the staff liaison of Honors and Awards (<u>rmasterson@ashrae.org</u>) before December 1st each year.

In addition to being a scientist, she fought for women's rights at the time alongside her neighbor and friend Elizabeth Cady Stanton. Her involvement was even noted when in a 1902, Susan B Anthony delivered a speech where she called on young feminists to continue and lead the work of the founders on the movement, including Eunice Newton Foote.

Foote died in September 1888 in Lenox. Massachusetts.

Established in the 2022-2023 ASHRAE Society Year, the Eunice Newton Foote Decarbonization Award recognizes an individual for notable achievement, outstanding work, or service focused on decarbonizing of the built environment. The form of the award is a plaque and medallion.

H&A MOP Motion

9. The committee will report only affirmative actions taken on nominations or selections. Sponsors of nominations that are not recommended to the Board Members Council will be so notified by the H&A Committee staff liaison.

 Recipients of awards and members eligible for advancement are not to be notified, or announcement made of such action, until Board Members Council approval has been received; recognition and presentation are to be made at the following Society conference.
 Award nominees to be recommended to the Board Members Council for the Hall of Fame must have been unanimously approved by the Honors and Awards Committee. For all other award nominees, only one negative vote will be allowed on any award recipient to be recommended to the Board of Directors Members Council. Two or more negative votes by the H&A Committee will defeat a motion and that individual will not be recommended to the Board Members Council.

9. Standing Rules

8. All voting for honors and awards of the Society shall be strictly secret and held at meetings of the Board of Directors and Members Council, and that the Honors and Awards Committee be instructed to place the necessary information for such voting before the Board at least two months prior to the applicable meeting.

14. Schedule

3.Nominations from the Honors and Awards Committee will be sent to the Board of Directors sixty (60) days prior to the Annual or Winter Conference <u>Members Council</u>. The nominees will be considered, and voted upon, by the Board <u>Members Council</u> at the Annual or Winter Conference.

B. Any notable person of preeminent professional distinction may be elected an Honorary Member. Election of an Honorary Member shall be by the Board of Directors <u>Members Council</u>. C. In submitting candidates for Honorary Member to the Boardfor vote, the Honors and Awards Committee shall include, in addition to the regular biographical record, a statement of reason for the selection of each person nominated. D. Nomination for Honorary Member shall be made by the Honors and Awards Committee to the Board of Directors <u>Members Council</u>. Election shall be by the BOD-<u>Members Council</u> and two or more negative votes shall cause the rejection of any proposed candidate.

2. Fellow Grade

A. Requirements for eligibility for election to the grade of Fellow by the Board of Directors Members Council:

B. In submitting the names of candidates for Fellow grade to the Board for vote, the Honors and Awards Committee shall include, in addition to the biographical record, a statement of reason for the selection of each person nominated.

C. Nominations for Fellow shall be made by the Honors and Awards Committee to the Board of Directors Members Council. Election shall be by the Board Members Council by secret ballot, and four or more negative votes by the BOD Members Council shall defeat the proposal.

3. Louise and Bill Holladay Distinguished Fellow Award

A. <u>The Board of Directors Members Council</u> approves the establishment of the "Louise and Bill Holladay Distinguished Fellow Award" to recognize a Fellow of the Society who continues preeminence in engineering or research.

B. The Honors and Awards Committee will submit the name of a candidate to the Board of Directors for approval. In addition to the biography, a statement of reason for the selection of the nominee should be included.

4. F. Paul Anderson Award

C. Nominations for the award shall be received by the Honors and Awards Committee for consideration, and the committee shall recommend to the BOD Members Council a candidate for approval. Approval of this award shall be by secret ballot of the BOD Members Council and two or more negative votes shall cause the rejection of any proposed candidate. D. In submitting the name of the candidate for the F. Paul Anderson Award to the BOD for vote, the Honors and Awards Committee shall include, in addition to the biographical record, a statement of reason for the selection of the candidate nominated.

5. ASHRAE Award for Distinguished Public Service

B. In submitting the name of the candidate for the ASHRAE Award for Distinguished Public Service to the BOD for their vote, the Honors and Awards Committee shall include, in addition to the regular biographical record, a statement of reason for the selection of the candidate nominated.

C. Nomination for the ASHRAE Award for Distinguished Public Service shall be made by the Honors and Awards Committee to the Board of Directors <u>Members Council</u>. Election shall be by secret ballot of the BOD-<u>Members Council</u>, and four or more negative votes shall cause the rejection of the proposed candidate.

6. Andrew T. Boggs Service Award

E. In submitting the name of the candidate for the Andrew T. Boggs Service Award to the BOD for their vote, the Honors and Awards Committee shall include, in addition to the regular biographical record, a statement of reason for the selection of the nominee.

F. Nominations for the award shall be received by the Honors and Awards Committee for consideration, and the committee shall recommend to the Board of Directors Members Council

a candidate for approval. Approval of this award shall be by secret ballot of the BOD <u>Members</u> <u>Council</u>, and four or more negative votes shall cause the rejection of any proposed candidate.

7. ASHRAE Hall of Fame

C. Nominations for the ASHRAE Hall of Fame shall be received by the Honors and Awards Committee for consideration, and the committee shall unanimously recommend to the Board of Directors Members Council for approval. Approval of this award shall be by secret ballot of the BOD Members Council and two or more negative votes shall cause the rejection of any proposed candidate.

8. ASHRAE Pioneers of the Industry

C. Nominations for the ASHRAE Pioneers of the Industry shall be received by the Honors and Awards Committee for consideration, and the committee shall unanimously recommend to the Board of Directors Members Council for approval. Approval of this award shall be by secret ballot of the BOD Members Council and two or more negative votes shall cause the rejection of any proposed candidate.
