Re: HB 339, "Real Property - Residential Rental Apartments - Air-Conditioning Requirements"

Dear Chair Korman and Committee Members:

I am writing on behalf of ASHRAE regarding House Bill 339, "Real Property - Residential Rental Apartments - Air-Conditioning Requirements." ASHRAE, a not-for-profit organization founded in 1894, is a professional and technical society that focuses on building systems, energy efficiency, indoor air quality, refrigeration and sustainability. ASHRAE has over 54,000 members, including over 1,000 in Maryland. ASHRAE supports the inclusion of ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 55-2023, Thermal Environmental Conditions for Human Occupancy and the reference to ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2022, Energy Efficiency for Sites and Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings in this bill, and encourages you to vote in favor of HB 339.

HB 339 would require air conditioning be provided for residential rental units that meets the acceptable temperature ranges that are established in ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 55-2023, *Thermal Environmental Conditions for Human Occupancy*. This standard describes the specific requirements and methods for achieving satisfactory thermal conditions, including temperature and humidity, for the substantial majority of occupants within a space. It is based on the best available science from experts on building design as well as day-to-day building operation. The most recent (2023) edition includes sections with specific guidance for designing, evaluating and adjusting HVAC systems to meet the standard. HB 339 also includes a definition from ANSI/ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2022, *Energy Efficiency for Sites and Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings*, which is referenced in order to clarify that the bill's requirements would apply to newly constructed units, and to units in apartment buildings that have undergone structural and systemic alterations. This bill will help to provide apartment residents with a healthy, safe and comfortable indoor environment, which is an essential part of ASHRAE's vision

of creating a healthy and sustainable built environment for all.
